The Audrey Irmas Gender Justice Project

The **Audrey Irmas Gender Justice Project (GJP)**, was launched in May 2017 with a generous grant from the Audrey Irmas Foundation for Social Justice. The mission of our project is to advance equality, justice and economic opportunity for low-income women and gender expansive individuals through a combination of direct legal services, policy advocacy, impact litigation, and community education. To date, GJP has focused its legal services in the areas of workplace rights and Title IX claims. GJP's direct services include a weekly workplace rights advice clinic, brief representation matters, administrative claims, and civil lawsuits. To date, we have assisted clients with discrimination claims based on sex, race, national origin, gender identity/expression, disability, and pregnancy; sexual harassment; sexual assault; labor and sex trafficking; job misclassification; benefits claims; leave issues; and wage theft. Most of our clients are people of color working at or just above the minimum wage in health services, domestic work, janitorial services, retail, restaurants and entertainment.

What do student interns do in GJP?

Students will assist GJP staff with legal research and writing, conducting intakes, and other assignments to support our representation of clients in gender equity and workplace justice litigation and administrative proceedings. Students may also assist GJP staff with developing and presenting Know Your Rights materials to support our community education efforts.
